NWAS WINTER SEASON



READING, LITERACY & CHANGING ATTITUDES

A common misconception is that once a student reaches high school they no longer need shared reading experiences. Studies by Walberg and Tsai (1983, 1985) found a strong correlation between a child's attitude to reading and their reading achievement (Partin & Hendricks, 2002, online). Several factors play a pivotal role in developing a teenager's positive attitude to reading.

- The positive influence of our teens' peers.
- The level of parental involvement.
- The home literary environment.
- The school literary environment.
- Positive role models - parents, extended family members, teachers, and support staff.

At home and at school, as adult caregivers, we are all in a unique position to make a positive contribution in developing and fostering a passion for reading among our teenagers. This can be something as simple as reading a newspaper article or reading a recipe when cooking with your child. This lasting legacy will be seen in your children's future achievements.

The Year 10 students were fortunate to listen to Mr Trevor Knuckey (a parishioner of St Anthony's in Greenmount and founder of the Medjugorje Centre in Perth) over the last two Mondays. Trevor spoke to the students about his conversion. He came from a dysfunctional family where his mother suffered from mental illness and was an alcoholic; she died when Trevor was 17. At this time, he turned away from his faith and lived a 'wild' lifestyle. It wasn't until many years later he felt he was being called back to his faith and was compelled to go to Medjugorje, a small village in Bosnia-Herzegovina. It is believed that apparitions of Our Lady first appeared to six children in 1981 and there have been apparitions since. This trip was life-changing for Trevor. HISTORY TOUR

On Monday 13 April, 54 students and 6 teachers departed Perth on our Colleges' first History Tour. Our tour took in Germany, France and Belgium.

First stop was Germany. We visited various places connected to our studies on Germany in World War 2 and the Cold War. These included the Reichstag concentration camps (Sauschesen and Dachau), the Berlin Wall, Checkpoint Charlie and the Nazi Rally grounds. We watched a Soccer match in Munchen, for many it was a new experience and a highlight.

Next was France, a place popular for tourists. Many were looking forward to it as it promised beautiful sites and a look into De La Salle's life. We visited the cathedrals in Reims, and in Paris we went to the Louvre, the Eiffel tower, war memorials and Euro Disney. It is a bit embarrassing when the students and teachers were more excited than the youngchildren.

Our last stop was Belgium where we remembered those who sacrificed themselves in World War 1. We visited memorials and attended services for the ANZACs. We had the privilege of speaking at a ceremony and laying a wreath at another. Belgium provided us with the time to reflect and to learn about the lives of those who died in World War 1. It was heart-breaking to see the mass of graves, even of boys that were our age.

Overall it was an unforgettable, eye opening experience, through the bonds and memories we created and the information that was shared. We would like to thank Mr Fitzpatrick and the accompanying teachers for this once in a lifetime experience.

Cyber Savvy Project 2015 Booster Summit

The Cyber Savvy Project is an initiative of the Telethon Kids Institute. During October last year, 4 Year 9 'ambassadors' from our College were chosen to attend the Cyber Savvy Summit. Researchers from the Telethon Kids Institute were seeking ground-level feedback in the area of protecting children in the cyber world, particularly with regard to image sharing. As a result of that day, mobile device apps and lesson curricula were developed based on the feedback received from the students.

Recently, on 7 May, 2 of our ambassadors, Catherine Daly and Jake Melia returned to the Booster Summit, along with nearly 40 other Year 10 Perth students. The day had two thrusts: firstly students received valuable and interesting upskilling in the area of leadership and personal growth, and, secondly, researchers asked the students to evaluate 2 mobile device apps and a curriculum plan that focused on helping young people deal with the issues around image sharing. The day was well structured combining games, discussion and presentations by the students. And, of course, everyone received a t-shirt!

The project is ongoing with further meetings between our ambassadors and Telethon Institute staff taking place in 'virtual' meetings. La Salle College is proud to be connected with such an important initiative.


