2017 YEAR 8 – 12 SUBJECT SELECTION ONLINE (SSO) – DUE WEEK 5

A reminder to students and parents that SSO is now available for students to make their preferred choices for next year. If you have any problems accessing SSO, for example, misplaced usernames and passwords, current Year Coordinators can be contacted. It is advisable that students and parents access the 2017 Curriculum Handbooks via the College website under Teaching and Learning.

- 2017 Year 8 choose 4 electives (2 each semester, 2 periods per week) + 2 reserves
- 2017 Year 9 choose 3 electives (year long, 2 periods per week) + 2 reserves
- 2017 Year 10 choose 2 electives (year long, 4 periods per week for each) + 2 reserves
NB Health & Physical Education and Humanities & Social Sciences are now compulsory in Year 10
- 2017 Year 11 choose 6 courses + 2 reserves in consultation with assigned Course Advisors
- 2017 Year 12 choose 6 courses + 2 reserves

All students must return the signed SSO form to their current Year Coordinator, with the exception of Year 10s who must return all their signed forms to their Course Advisor.

CERTIFICATE II IN FURNITURE MAKING (Pre-Apprenticeship)

The Certificate II in Furniture Making (Cabinet Making/Furniture Making Pre-Apprenticeship) is a specialised course for all students wishing to pursue a career in the cabinet making/furniture making industry. The aim is to provide students with an opportunity to complete a full Certificate II in conjunction with WACE. This year, in partnership with North Metropolitan TAFE (formerly Polytechnic West) the course has run at school in the Br Fitzhardinge Trade Skills Centre. Due to its success and popularity the certificate will be offered again for 2017.

The course will be delivered one day per week, over a 12-month period. As this is a pre-apprenticeship course, students will also be required to attend intensive learning blocks in January and during the College examination periods. Students will also be immersed into relevant industry*work placement.

** Work placement comprises of three one week blocks during the school holidays.*

Any student who wishes to select this course as one of their options will need to see Mr DiPino directly. If this course is selected students will also need to choose Careers and Enterprise (Year 11) or Certificate II Vocational Pathways (Year 12).

File type:
Do you know you're looking for a PDF?, or a Docx?, or a JPG?

Set the file type in the search.
Example:
Classpad II user guide filetype:pdf
Reduces the number of results by 99.5%.

Site:
Limit your search to certain kinds of site. This is particularly good for increasing reliability of information.
Example:
Ningaloo site:wa.gov.au
Gives only sites from the WA government and reduces the search results by 98%.

Quotation marks – the exact phrase finder

If you know some exact words, or want pages that contain what you think someone would write about your topic,
Use quotation marks.
Example: **"Reasons for Rainforest Destruction"** returns 95% fewer pages than if the quotation marks were omitted.



Boolean operator OR

happy joy will give results which include both words.
happy OR joy will give occurrences of either word.

The negative sign

Using a negative sign will avoid sites with that word.
Example:
Caterpillar -inc -Cat -equipment
Will avoid numerous sites about the tractor company.

Is it up to date?

Go to **archive.org**.
Put the URL of a site into the **"waybackmachine"** field.
You'll get an update history of the site.
Example: **www.lasalle.wa.edu.au** was last updated on 5 April this year. It opened on 22 Dec 1997.

Vehicles

School Parking



Parking restrictions are put in place near schools to protect children when they are either picked up from or dropped off to school.

Parking Signs

Parking signs show if there are any parking restrictions in the area. You should always look for and read parking signs when parking your vehicle. If you do not comply with the parking signs you may be infringed.

A "No Stopping" sign will show you where vehicles are not permitted to stop for any length of time, unless avoiding a collision.

Signs may also have day and time restrictions. This means the parking prohibitions apply only during the times and days shown.



Stand Vehicle Facing the Wrong Way

Parked vehicles must face the same way as the direction of traffic flow and not facing oncoming traffic.

Verge Parking


Verge parking within the City is generally regulated with signage. Where no signage is in place, the adjacent land owner/occupier should be approached for consent to park on the verge.

Parking on Median Strips, Traffic Islands and Roundabouts

It is not acceptable to park a vehicle on a median strip, traffic island or roundabout. These controls divide traffic to make driving on busy roads safer.

Parking on or over a Footpath

Footpaths are for the safe passage of pedestrians. Vehicles should not be parked on or over a footpath as this will cause an obstruction.
