WELCOME TO TERM 3

The students played at a number of schools, shopping malls and at Universal Studios. Their repertoire was phenomenal and was thoroughly enjoyed by the large number of guests who were entertained by their outstanding musical skills. It was especially enjoyable to see 20 members of the College Choir accompany the Band during their public performances. My sincere thanks to Chris Milne for his overall coordination of the tour and the other staff who supervised our students. SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM

SCHOOL READINESS TEST (SRT)

In order to prepare for the transition to NAPLAN Online (National Assessment Programme – Literacy and Numeracy) a number of schools have been selected to do the SRT. Our College is one of the selected schools. We will be running a one hour *Omnibus Test* (questions across both numeracy and literacy) for all Year 7 students. This test will occur in either Week 5 or 6 of this term, the exact date is yet to be determined. The aim of the test is determine if the ICT (Information and Communication Technology) infrastructure has sufficient capacity to cope and to see if the security procedures associated with NAPLAN going online are robust.

The test results are not used or recorded against the individual student. However, it is a good opportunity for our Year 7s to become familiar with the online testing process which will be used the next time they sit the NAPLAN test.

ONLINE LITERACY & NUMERACY ASSESSMENT (OLNA)

The second round of OLNA testing is scheduled for Weeks 8 and 9 of this term. Students in Years 10, 11 and 12 who have not yet demonstrated *Category 3 Standard* for Numeracy, Reading or Writing will have an opportunity to do so at this time. Whilst personalised results have already been sent home we will once again send these together with a letter which gives further details about OLNA.

The school is working with all students who have yet to demonstrate Category 3 Standard by conducting:

- After school tutorials for English and Mathematics (announced in the Daily Notices).
- Specialised lessons in various classes (e.g. GCE classes, Mathematics Essentials, etc.).

NETFLIX FILM 'TO THE BONE' – INFORMATION FROM THE BUTTERFLY FOUNDATION

You may be aware that Netflix is currently promoting across social media the release of 'To the Bone', a film following the journey of a 20 year old woman living with and recovering from anorexia nervosa.

Butterfly wants to ensure the safety of young people and is significantly concerned about how parents and those working with young people best address any issues that may arise for those who watch 'To the Bone'.

Eating disorders (anorexia nervosa, bulimia nervosa, binge eating disorder) are complex neuropsychiatric disorders that manifest in disordered eating and exercise behaviours. Although serious mental illnesses, they result in physical impairment and they have a high mortality rate, including very elevated levels of suicide risk.

The graphic content of 'To the Bone' – both visual and audio – **may be triggering** for someone with or at risk of an eating disorder. For those who are not so vulnerable, it may still be disturbing, and possibly distressing. In this context we suggest that parents and others make every attempt to view the film with their children or other young people.

Butterfly is also encouraging parents and those who work with young people to engage in conversation with them around the film. The positive aspect of 'To the Bone' is that it will raise awareness of the complexities, challenges and fears for someone living with an eating disorder, including their families. To that end, we hope it will help to reduce stigma and promote an attitude of seeking help. **Information has been provided along with guidance on the website, which can be accessed at:**

However, as there are risks for vulnerable people who see the film, we urge them to contact **Butterfly's National Helpline ED HOPE**. The line is staffed by counsellors who are experts in eating disorders and body image concerns and is open from 8:00 am – 9:00 pm AEST Monday to Friday. 


On the morning before the recent Parent/Teacher/Student interviews, College staff were privileged to have a professional development session with Holly-Ann Martin from Safe4Kids.

While the topics were wide ranging in the area of child safety, one particular fact involving Information and Communication Technology stood out: **the ease with which inappropriate content can come via YouTube**, even when parental controls are in place on wifi routers or search engines. The danger areas are the 'comment' and 'suggested' zones.



Depending on the audience attracted to a video, undesirable commentary and replies can easily occur. This can involve bullying, negativity and rudeness. Comments may contain links to sites a child may not have seen under normal circumstances.



Quite innocent gaming videos may call up 'suggested' videos which are connected through their title or tags. These can contain anything, from rude language up to pornographic rip-offs. (This has happened with Minecraft.)

The **Safe4Kids Facebook page** is well worth a visit. Featured there you will find an excellent video about keeping your child safe on YouTube. It's here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2iqy6H7_jeY.

See easy steps to:

1. Turn on YouTube's safety mode.
2. Block unwanted commentators.
3. Report abuse to YouTube.
4. Moderate comments (remove ones you don't want).
5. Monitor your child's activity, see their history etc.



When you watch this YouTube video, your 'suggested' panel will give you similar content, including ways to better secure your child's phone.
