

At any time in our large community we have many members who have family or friends who are experiencing difficulties and challenges. I ask Our Lord to look over these precious people and their families knowing that our Lord is always with us through all of the challenges in life.

PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS

I would request that parents remind their children of the importance of remaining vigilant when travelling to and from school. Sadly, there are a small number of people who can have intentions which can place young people in danger. If your child feels unsafe they should remain calm and approach someone whom they can trust. If your child walks to school, I would recommend that they stay in public view and avoid short cuts and laneways. Of particular concern is the walkway which follows the creek parallel to Frederic Street. This area is out of bounds for La Salle students; however, we regularly receive reports of some students using this as a thoroughfare.

If your child is approached by anyone on their way to or from school who makes them feel unsafe they should immediately let a member of staff know. Please remind your children not to engage in conversations or any interactions with strangers and where possible travel with their friends.


