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TERCENTENARY OF THE DEATH OF ST JOHN BAPTIST DE LA SALLE

On Sunday 25 November Br David Hawke (FSC), Provincial of the De La Salle Brothers of the District of ANZPPNG and College Board Chairperson, Joe Marino will officially unveil a statue of St John Baptist de La Salle. This event will mark the commencement of the official year of celebrations to commemorate the death 300 years ago of our Founder. All Lasallian schools and organisations around the world will be marking this milestone with a year of prayer, reflection and thanksgiving.

Our school community is so blessed and enriched by being part of the Lasallian family of schools. Our Lasallian charism is a foundation upon which our school was built and continues to flourish. Our beautiful new statue will serve as an ongoing and tangible reminder of our Catholic and Lasallian identity.

YEAR 10 OUTDOOR EDUCATION CAMP

With the recent completion of the Year 10 Outdoor Education Camp, it has been interesting to hear many of the students reflect upon the achievements they have experienced as part of their participation in such an awesome programme. While history shows that both students and staff have achieved great success on these camps, due to the many extremes that they face, people would agree that one of the most important functions of a camp like this is to provide a balanced and holistic education, out of the classroom.

This year's camp was no different. With the long hours of preparation in class to be able to tie knots, abseil and climb the new rock-climbing wall, this all came to fruition on Wednesday 31 October. An early start saw 55 students and 10 staff head to Margaret River, to a camping area by the name of Conto's.

Conto's has no showers, no hot water and only drop toilets. There is little doubt that this brought a sense of spirit and identity to the students, and some staff! Students cooked on Trangias and prepared all of their meals in groups. They prepared themselves for days out at Giants Cave, Wilyabrup Sea Cliffs and various other abseiling sites. This developing of spirit led to an increased enjoyment of the overall experience and a heightened sense of pride in what they had achieved over the four days on camp.

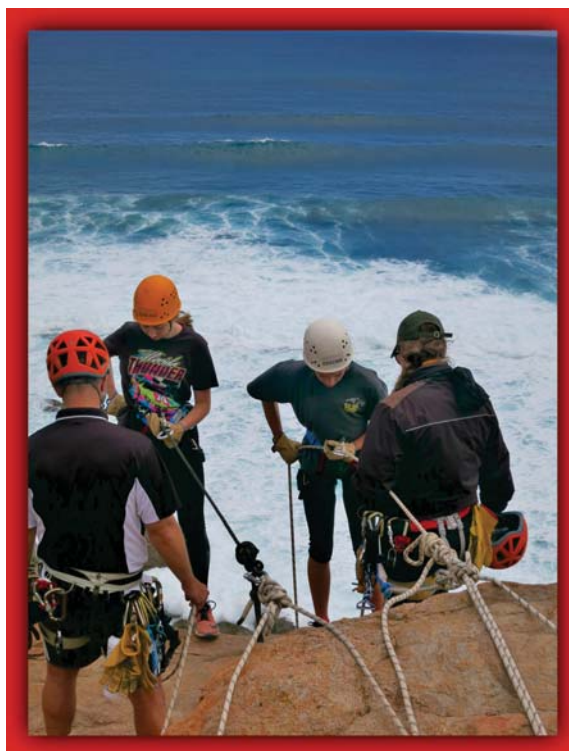
A definite highlight for many students was watching three whales frolicking just off shore for 30 minutes.

The significant reason for encouraging camping involvement in the Outdoor Education programmes, is the very positive attributes that we wish all students to acquire – leadership, discipline and teamwork. These are qualities which can be taught in several settings but are most effectively learned in an environment where the students are enjoying themselves. Abseiling off a 46m cliff did this for some. Night caving was another. For others it was the joy of playing co-op games within our groups, or Zombie Apocalypse chasey against the staff.

Our Outdoor Education programme is centred upon participation and engagement. It is an important part of the total offering of the College and I commend all of the students who accepted the available opportunities and represented the College with great pride and enthusiasm.

I would also like to thank the following staff, who always work hard and enjoy themselves on these camps, Ms Doyle, Mr Reilly, Mr Dunne, Ms McDonnell, Ms Muhling, Mr Carson, Mr Milligan, Ms Kazakoff and Ms Cusworth.
